

- The new organization delivers "health", not "healthcare".





Problem Statement #2



Problem Statement #3

- Oregon Representative Mitch Greenlick:
 - Health Reform in the Affordable Care Act era is made up of "halfway technologies".
 - Example
 - The iron lung was invented to treat individuals with polio
 - It addressed the symptoms, not the underlying problem
 - In contrast to the polio vaccine, which was a full technology
 - <u>All</u> of the exciting health reform work going on in Oregon fits into the category of "halfway technologies".

Translation...

- While Oregon is touted as the most successful state in the country in terms of Medicaid reform, succeeding in
 - Keeping the health care cost growth to 3.4% per year
 - Showing great outcomes (ER Use, Primary Care Visits, Diabetes Control, etc.)
- It's not doing enough to create a shift from a Sick Care System to a true Health System

- Neighborhood Union Primary Care Partnership was the first of four one-stops.

- The Neighborhood Union Primary Care Partnership's One Stop Shopping:
 - · Well patient care
 - Sick-patient care
 - OB/GYN services
 - Travel immunization services
 - Communicable disease intervention
 - WIC/nutrition education
 - · Oral health services
 - Behavioral health services



- Employment assistance
- Disability and vocation rehabilitation services
- Foreclosure prevention services
- Housing assistance

What's in the Health Neighborhood?

- The second one-stop, The North Fulton Government Service Center has all of the above plus:
 - A day center for the children of parents receiving services
 - A branch of the public library
 - A reading room/information center that offers ESL classes
 - An office where you can pay your parking tickets and taxes
 - A farmer's market
 - A community garden
 - A walking trail







Stress Management Specialist

- Actively practicing the postures, meditation, breathing techniques and Program lifestyle










Example: West Seattle 2010 Census
