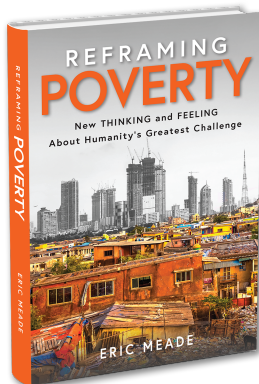
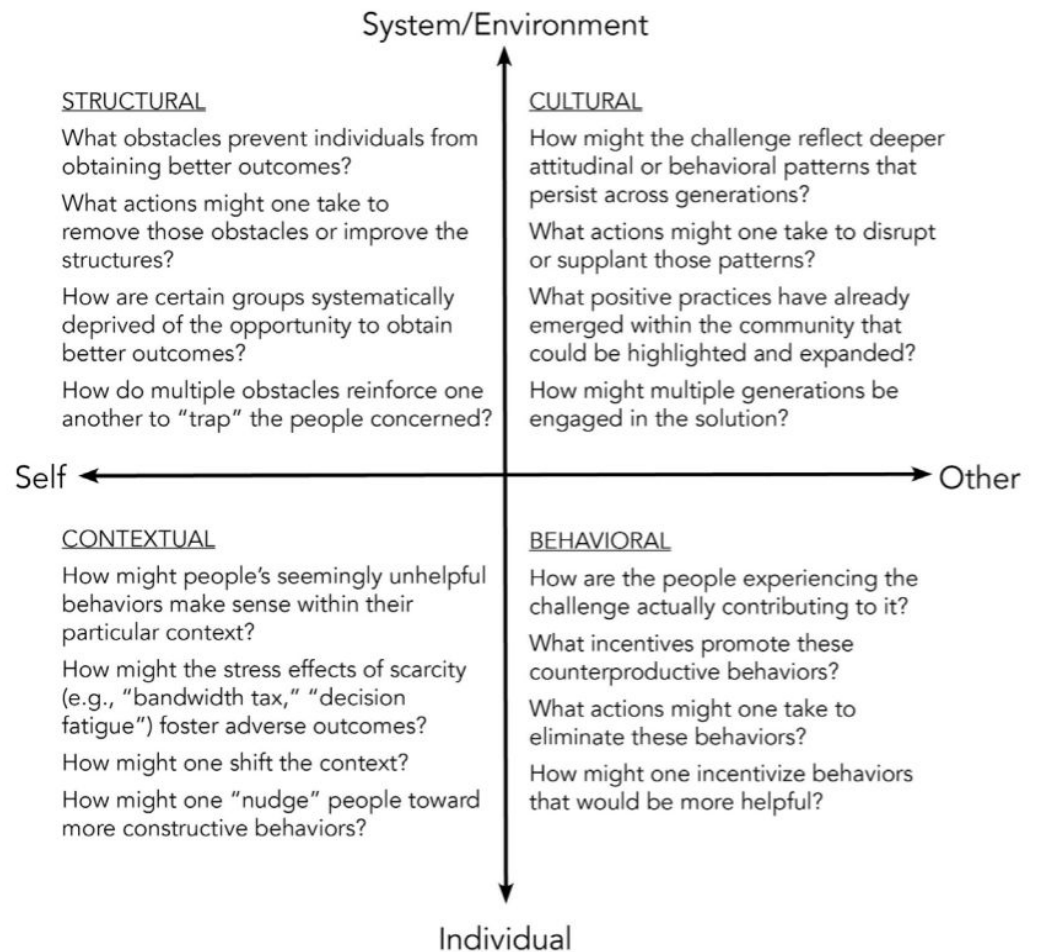
Exploring Responses to Poverty Through Multiple Perspectives

A CBHC Pre-Conference, September 25, 2019

This session will explore alternative explanations of poverty as a gateway to innovative interventions that participants can prototype and develop. Why are some people poor? What should we do about it? These questions have prompted many different answers for hundreds of years. This pre-conference will invite participants to find new insights and opportunities for their work by applying a variety of perspectives on poverty – even those they would rather avoid!

Throughout the day we will work with this framework (see figure, right), which captures four main views of poverty. We will explore the cognitive and emotional attributes of each quadrant, as well as the opportunities for innovation that each quadrant may offer. You will have an opportunity to prototype some of these innovations and then bring them back to your own communities.
