Permanent Supportive Housing: An Evidence Based, Trauma Informed, Long-Term Housing Solution for People Who Are Leaving Homelessness with Behavioral Health Needs.

This session will provide an overview of Permanent Supportive Housing and how it is a solution to providing trauma-informed housing and supportive services to people experiencing homelessness or housing instability. PSH supports individuals and families in need of behavioral health and other supportive services to remain housed and thrive.
