
Mobilizing Addiction Treatment: MAT on Wheels CBHC 2021

Mobile Health Units (MHU)

- Funded by the State Opioid Response Grant through the Colorado Office of Behavioral Health
- Six MHU's focus on providing services to rural communities in Colorado
- Staffed by a nurse (LPN), addiction counselor, and a peer support specialist; patients connect to a medical provider via telehealth
- Follows a weekly schedule and visits designated sites each week

Embedded Clinics

- Intention is to meet people where they are and reduce the barriers to care
- Partnering with local agencies and community service providers to build on existing rapport
- Minimal space needed and staffed with one individual and a "clinic in a suitcase"



Outreach Notes and Experiences

- We are the addiction experts, the community is the expert of their needs
- Identify community stakeholders, early in the project they were engaged in a readiness assessment and played an active role in determining need and the best place to provide services
- Outreach and engagement doesn't stop after you have found parking/space, fostering the relationship and keeping the community involved is as important as initial engagement

 Allow stakeholders to come and go as they choose to provide their expertise for the project
