
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Analytics

- Broad adoptions of the Health Care Payment Learning and Action Network Alternative Payment Methodology Framework


Colorado Context

- Significant fiscal investment in the behavioral health system

Growing Focus on Social Determinants of Health and Equity

2020 served as a catalyst for a noticeable shift in state focus. Many states are increasing their focus on health equity and social determinants of health via different payment reforms, authority, and infrastructure investment.

- Managed Care contract or other payment reform requirements
