CBHC recognizes that the safety of all of those at our annual behavioral health training conference is our top priority. Our commitment to all COVID-19 Policies is to treat this as a living document that will continue to evolve, based on state and federal guidance. We are committed to ensuring all participants have been provided guidelines for ensuring a safe and healthy experience on site at the Beaver Run Resort & Conference Center.



Waivers: All attendees will be required to sign a waiver to ensure they are aware of the CBHC COVID-19 Policies and precautions being taken on site, and agree to comply with the safety measures. Here's how we are committing to keeping you safe on site!


Beaver Run Staff: All Beaver Run staff are under health protocols for your safety requiring self-screening for any symptoms. If they have a temperature above 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, they must stay home and may not return to work until they are symptom free for at least three days, and at least seven days have passed since symptoms first appeared. **Beaver Run Employee Guidelines:** BeaverRunEmployeeGuidelines



Masks: All Beaver Run staff will be wearing masks on site. All attendees are strongly encouraged to wear masks in public areas when not consuming food or beverage based on CDC recommendations. Should local mandates change and attendees be required to wear masks we will update you.



Hand Sanitizer Stations: Hand sanitizer dispensers will be located at the water stations throughout the conference center. Hand washing and limited physical touching (handshakes, hugs, etc.) are important in helping to reduce the spread of COVID-19. All staff and attendees are asked to wash their hands frequently and for the CDC recommended 20 seconds.





Meeting Rooms & Exhibit Hall: Meeting areas will follow social distancing guidelines. Floor signs provided in the exhibit hall and registration area are to remind attendees of social distancing measures.

Self-administered Health Checks: All attendees are asked to monitor their own health and temperature. If you are experiencing any flu like symptoms you should stay home.

Social Distancing Signage & Ribbons: All attendees are asked to respect physical social distancing through signage, and Comfort Level Ribbons to communicate your personal preferences.
