Planning Grant Award

Colorado received a one year planning grant in December 2024. HCPF and BHA are working collaboratively with stakeholders to define quality measure and data management processes, certification and provider readiness, and the prospective payment system for demonstration. If awarded and funding identified, the demonstration will begin July 2026.
